As housing has become increasingly unaffordable and government subsidy falls far short of need, there is an urgent need to preserve, or build more of, the nation's supply of un-subsidized, "naturally occurring affordable housing." Bringing together leading housing academics, policy makers, and practitioners from the public, private, and innovation spheres, the Kreisman Housing Law and Policy Initiative's annual symposium, "Missing Middle Housing: The Key to Scaling Affordability?" will center around whether building and preserving "missing middle housing" — the tier of housing that falls between single family homes and high-rises — can create more affordable housing options in the United States.
